WebWrite the literature review in the past tense; the research has already been completed. The article cannot “do”, “find”, or “say” anything. The authors are the people who conducted the study. The above format is a guideline. It may be necessary to change the verbs or to expand an idea.

WebOrder and Tense There is a preferred order when writing objectives. The condition is usually placed first, followed by the behavior or verb, and then the criteria. Objectives are written in the future tense. For example:
Recall: After attending lecture and reading the assigned materials, the student will state the function of a thermometer.
